

## **Glenorchy Task Force Meeting Agenda**

- 1. Minutes of last meeting all ok minor adjustments made my AG
- 2. Environmental Log Requirements for outstanding landscape (hand out)
  - a. Discussed need to have district plan definition of 'outstanding national beauty'. This is influenced by the District plan and environment court.
  - b. Discussed cumulative effects in town of light, noise eg heat pumps.
  - c. Powerlines underground is there any way we can move it forward? Discussed effects of powerlines on views in the township. Recommendation GCA follow up with Delta re getting the powerlines put underground.
  - d. Buildings Current guidelines from the 2001 Community Plan incorporated into the District Plan is still current and valid. Some people don't agree but there will always be individuals.
  - e. Reiterate need for continual review of planning and areas to make sure that natural landscapes are protected, specific visual corridors are identified and protected. Make sure that QLDC process consults with the community regarding different areas.
  - f. Development is planned taking into account visual corridors that need protected eg view from Bennetts Bluff. AG suggested that it might be outside of the scope of this task force to specifically look at specific area/corridors/development etc.
  - g. Recommendation GCA should make a submission to the Annual Plan to get ORC to establish a baseline for Glenorchy on water and air. ORC/Landcare are establishing a baseline for groundwater up the Dart in conjunction with the farmers. Some wells are monitored, may need a submission to get all of the information collated from ORC
  - h. Fire in zone 3 currently dry wood, untreated wood and no industrial waste. At current predicted levels of growth, these restrictions should still ensure that air pollution is still kept to a minimum. For the GY area firewood is a naturally occurring and sustainable option for the community.
  - i. GY should be leading the way in sustainable/environmental leadership for small communities.
  - j. Sewage opportunity for Glenorchy to lead the way in environmentally sound, long term solutions. Discussed the cost of being sustainable eg sustainable sewage system may cost more. Education of QLDC in sustainable methods eg Kapiti Coast have educated councillors in sustainability therefore they work from that platform.
  - k. Recycling great system in place at the moment zero waste difficult to achieve. Its about education, making good choices re food purchases, packaging. AH run a timebank barter time based on activities eg Manakau School use time bank for the

- people who come in and read at the school. Examples: Littleton, Raglan, Otaki. Project Eden UK.
- I. Light pollution need to be conscious of it eg photography is a big thing at the moment, we need to protect the natural night sky aurora's. Developments on the hill, naked bulbs more visible. Eg Ohau lighting is a good example of good lighting.
- m. Infill of lake will be filled in to GY in 50 years. Encourage gravel extraction. Town needs to be lifted to future proof them against rising lake levels.
- n. Agriculture Sustainability is moving along in different ways. The Rees Valley already has a group in place.
- o. Noise heat pumps creating ambient noise. Need to make sure that the heat pumps are being used efficiently.
- p. Aviation current movements in and out of airport maintain current status. Local operators good at being conscious of noise pollution affecting GY.
- 3. Survey Tussock reason for repeating is comments re community is changing. Could use 2001 as a baseline could repeat it now to see how the community has changed? Would be good to see if the community values have changed, are of the old issues still relevant. Tussock to send AG copy of 2001 survey to take to the SG for comment.
- 4. Administration going forward AG suggested they think about someone that might be able to take minutes, circulate etc instead of AG
- 5. Luke leaving at the end of August.
- 6. Other issues: exotic plants??? May need more work.
- 7. Sewage need to discuss next time.
  - a. Need a sustainable system:
  - b. Zero water, zero waste, zero impact.
  - c. Recommendation for a sustainable/environmentally sustainable sewage system.
  - d. Can Shaping our Future help group with forum results to submit behind Tussock group. Log appears there is two different groups supporting two different systems. AG to look through raw data and see if we could provide Tussock with some information for the council.
