



Impact100 Wakatipu has announced \$208,000 in total grants available for 2023, meaning two local charities will receive \$100,000 each and the balance will be divided between the three runners-up out of the Final Five that will be presented to our supporters in October.

We are now calling for expressions of interest from local charities to apply for the two major \$100,000 grants.

Grant applications must provide benefit in one or more of the following sectors:

- i. **Arts and Culture** – the promotion of cultural awareness and participation in the arts for the purposes of learning.
- ii. **Lifewide Learning** – promotion of educational initiatives that encourage learning at all stages, and in all contexts of life.
- iii. **Community Health and Wellbeing** – includes public health, emergency response, social services, mental health, strengthening families, elder care and Maori, Pasifika and other ethnic support services.
- iv. **Community Recreation** – engaging people of all ages in activities that promote physical and mental wellbeing.
- v. **Heritage and Environment** – promotion, preservation and enhancement of the physical and historical uniqueness of the region.

To qualify for consideration for the grant, applicants must be a registered charity, be based in the Wakatipu, and must have a project to the value of at least \$100,000.
