We have had measles alerts and this is also whooping cough season so keep an eye on those little people around the house.

Info from the Ministry on Measles

Since April there have been at least 50 confirmed cases of measles in New Zealand. Cases have been reported in Waikato, Northland, Nelson, Marlborough and Horowhenua. Measles is a highly infectious disease that affects both adults and children. Measles is more serious than many people realise. Of the recent cases in New Zealand, seven people have required hospital treatment. Measles starts with a fever, cough, runny nose and/or sore eyes followed a few days later by a rash. People are infectious from 5 days before to 5 days after the rash appears.

You can still be immunised – contact your medical practitioner.

Community Engagement on Future Education provision in the Wakatipu

The Ministry of Education is currently working on plans for future education provision in the Wakatipu Basin area, and is seeking your input. This is an exciting opportunity for parents and the whole community to contribute innovative ideas and have input into future education provision.

The first phrase of the engagement will involve face-to-face public workshops, facilitated by Dr Gabrielle Wall, to gather and explore ideas about future education provision. These are scheduled as follows:-

- Tuesday 7th June, 5:30—6:30pm, Remarkables Primary School
- Tuesday 7th June, 7-8pm, Arrowtown School
- Wednesday 8th June, 6-7pm, St Joseph's School
- Thursday 9th June, 4:30pm-5:30pm, Kingsview School
- Thursday 9th June, 6-9pm, Queenstown Primary School
- Thursday 9th June, 7:30pm-8:30pm, Shotover Primary School

These sessions are all open to the public and parents or interested community members can attend any session. Please note that while similar content will be covered in each of the six meetings, the workshop held at St Joseph's School will include additional discussions on Catholic Schooling in the Wakatipu Basin area.

The ideas and themes generated through this first phrase will then be used to construct an online survey that will make it possible to identify which options and ideas have a wider base of support. The online survey will be open from June 27th to July 15th.
