It is looking likely that New Zealand teachers will take industrial action on Wednesday 15 August if an agreement is not reached before then. At this stage, no final decision has been made, but we will continue to keep you updated as we hear more. If you are interested in knowing more, we are holding a Parent Meeting on Friday 3 August at 3:00pm in the Junior Room to outline the issues.

#### Note from the Board of Trustees re Industrial Action
