

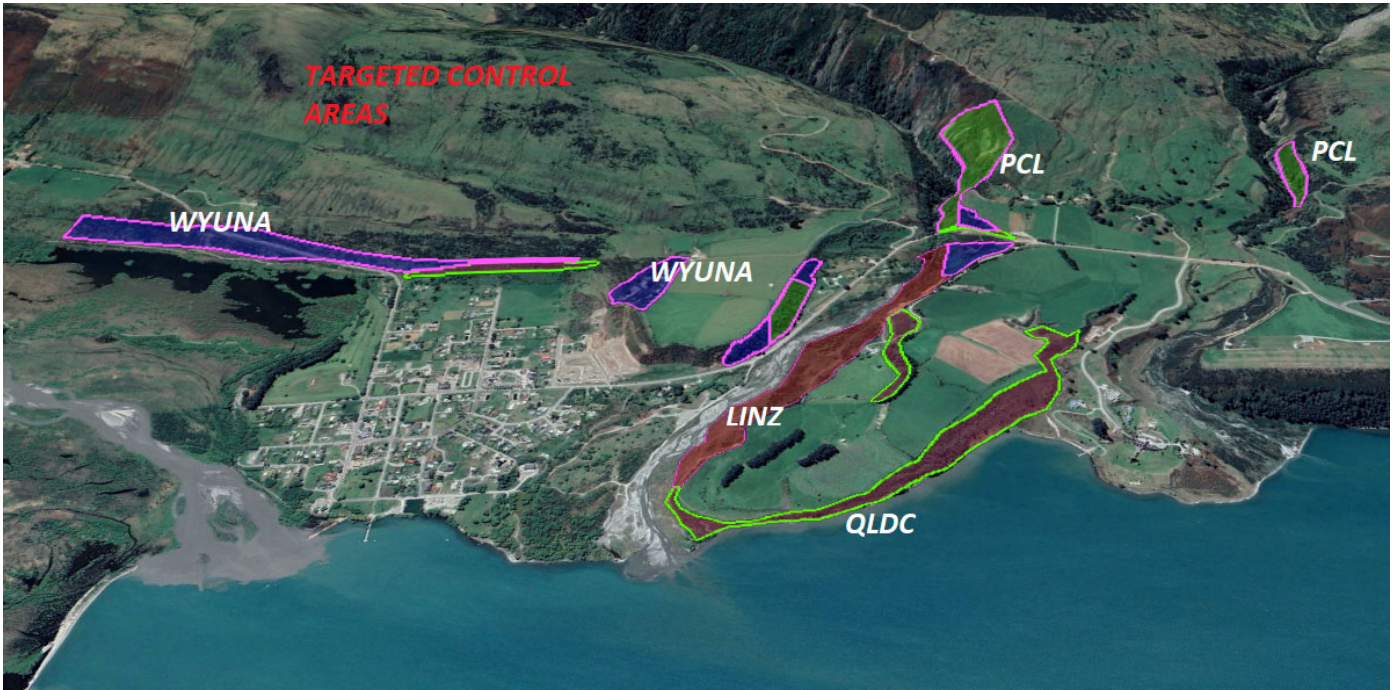
Wilding Conifer Control - Operational Prescription

Situation:	<p>Around the township of Glenorchy there are a number of small pockets of Wilding conifers that to many people go unnoticed, but with recent prolific growth these trees are beginning to establish as the start of major infestations.</p> <p>The predominant origin of this spread is from town plantings and Rural shelterbelts, and in the worst affected area under the Blanket Bay recreation reserve (and pony club access road) there is now a thick growing forest of Douglas fir juveniles sitting directly under an old Douglas fir Shelterbelt.</p> <p>There are a variety of Wilding conifer species causing concern; Douglas Fir, Corsican (<i>Pinus nigra</i>), Larch and Radiata. Wilding conifers are recognised as New Zealand's number 1 worst weed and invasive pest and all these species pose a significant threat to the ecological, agricultural and landscape values of the Glenorchy area.</p>
Mission:	Remove all wilding conifer, seedlings, juveniles, and mature coning trees (except shelterbelts) from within prescribed blocks
Time frame:	1 to 2 weeks work during the month of September/October 2020.

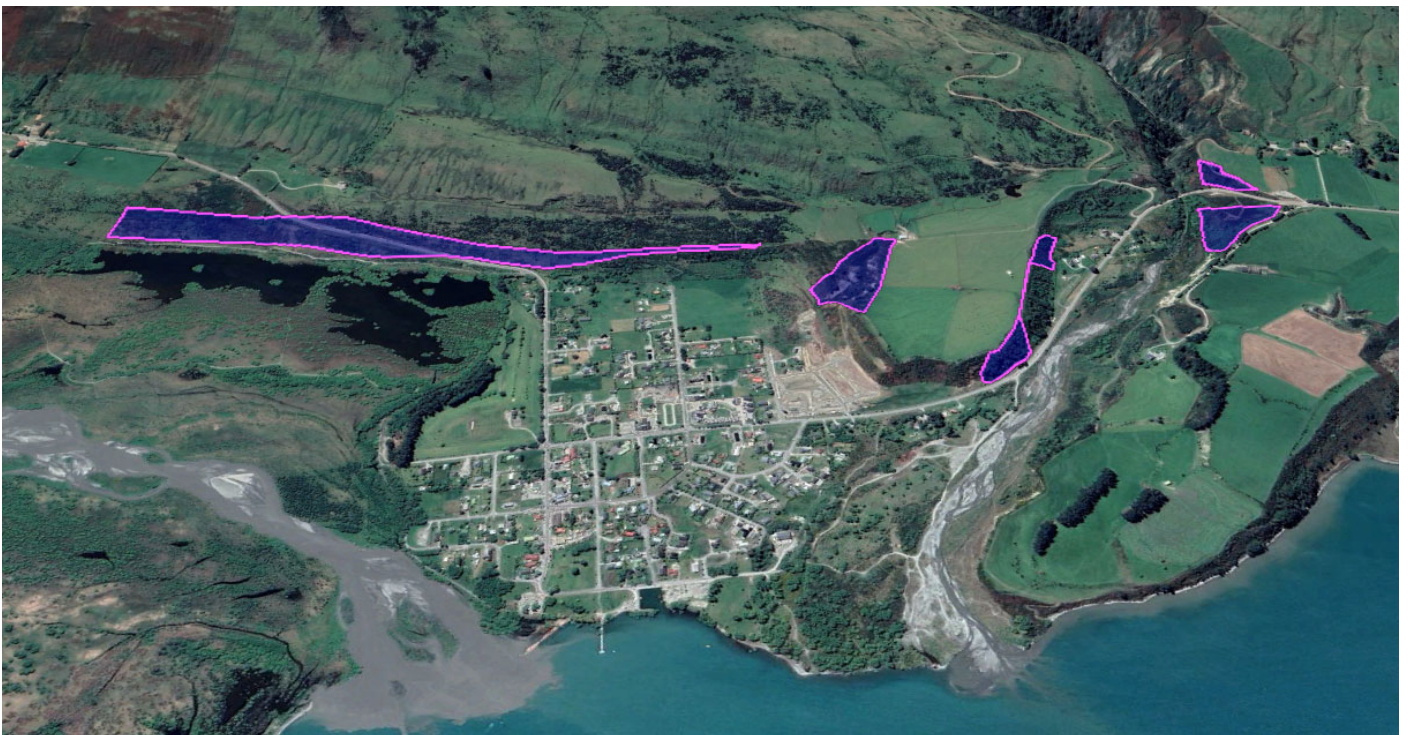

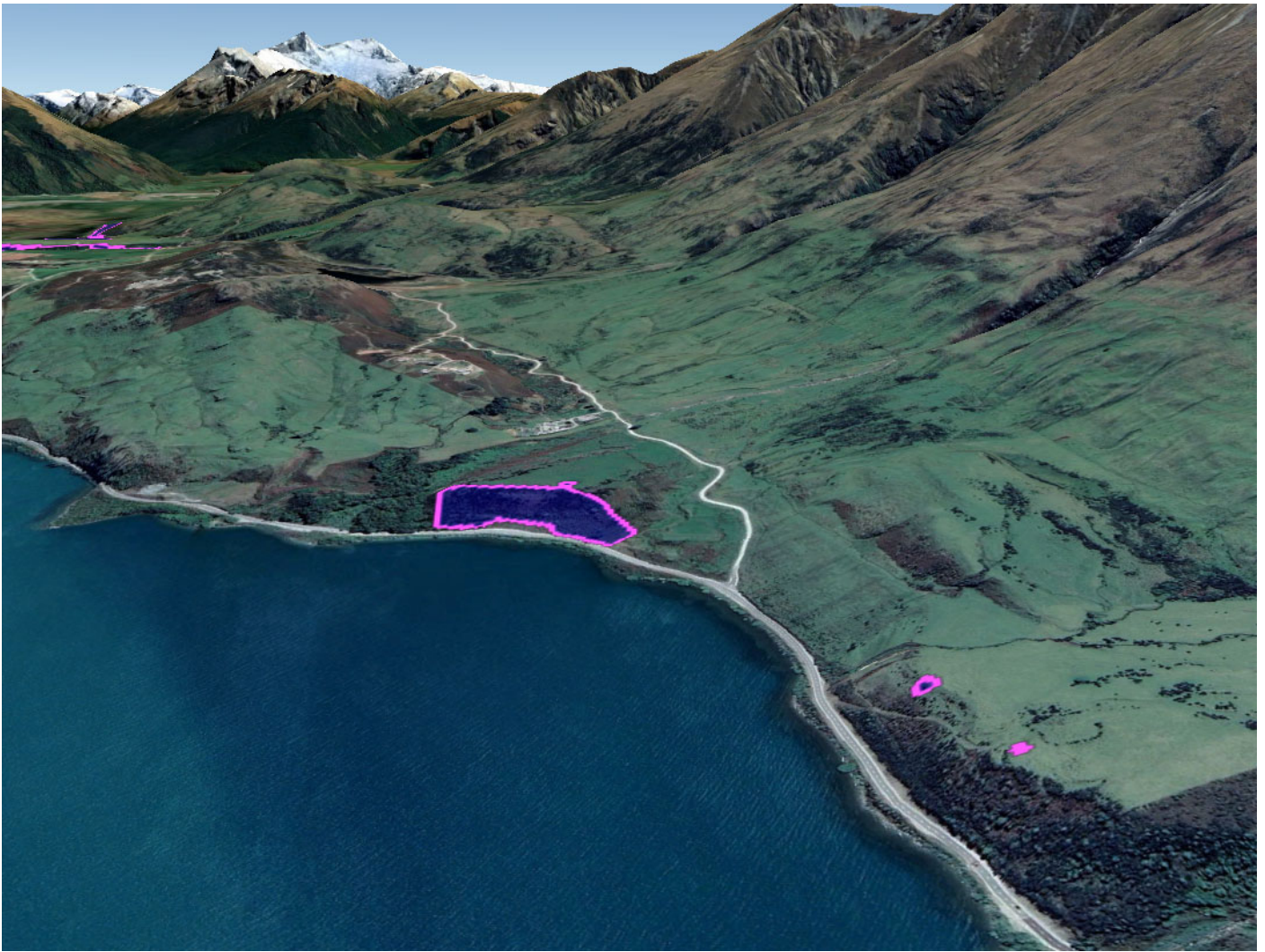
