Hello Glenorchy School Pupils

I'm the old teacher who taught at your wonderful school many years ago – in fact 1968 to 1974. That might seem a long time ago to you but only yesterday for me. I have been reading the school letters on the Glenorchy Website (a great website) and following all your activities as the year goes on. And what exciting activities they are. Camping, spelling quiz, visits to other schools, orienteering, and skiing. (I had a go at skiing once but spent most of my time with my bottom in the snow and my skis over my shoulders). I see you are still enjoying skating. Well I can tell you a story about that.

In my first year teaching in Glenorchy we did have some sort of summer sports on Wednesday afternoons but when the winter came I had no idea what to do for a sport. There were only a dozen pupils ranging from five year olds to twelve year olds. Football was not on, and same with hockey or even netball. We couldn't travel for sporting activities because the road wasn't quite finished and it was really bad in the winter. So on the first day of the second term (we had only 3 terms then) I went to school with lots of preparation but a blank in my workbook for Wednesday afternoon.

Then came a surprise! Half way through lunch time on Wednesday some parents in cars arrived at the school gate and started to herd the children into the vehicles. I was worried because I didn't know what was going on. "Don't worry," said Mrs Eileen Koch, "Hop in the car too." We travelled in convoy to a pond in the bush just near the Jordan Creek.

Everybody hopped out and started to put on skates – and there was even a pair for me. Not only a pair of skates but a stable broom to help me stay on my feet while I was learning. And could those children skate. Even the 5 year olds could skate past me at speed and laugh at their teacher sprawled all over the ice. The same thing happened every Wednesday afternoon but by the end of the term I could stay on my feet and move slowly round the circuit without the stable broom.

It showed me what a wonderful community spirit there was in the area and also how pupils can teach the teacher.
