#### 7. General business

#### 7.1 Glenorchy Story Walk

Natasya Zambri, the Wakatipu Community Engagement Librarian, has proposed a story walk along the walkway of Mull St. and Benmore Place. The funding for one in Glenorchy has already been approved, choosing a location is the next step.

Requested from a local library patron to get a story walk installed. It would be 18 board panels along a route, each panel telling a page from a story

With the upcoming playground relocation, it was suggested to be installed by the skatepark with the new playground and dark skies installment

Suggested to Natasya to talk to the parks team about putting it into the new playground location

Approx Cost for a story walk: \$5000

#### 7.2 A community Gym has been proposed

Lilia Andrade & Daniel Nogueira have proposed a gym be set up in the Glenorchy Hall, and sent through a proposal summary.

The equipment would be easily moved, but a storage shed is needed to move the equipment for events

Idea is keep the membership fees low, give each member an entry code The equipment will be donated from QLDC, being retired gym equipment QLDC is backing the project, and will help enact a health and safety plan, insurance, etc.

The GCA is going to look into what the change would be to our insurance costs.



Next steps: insurance updates, health and safety plan, hall access, membership policies Business Operations plan Budget and Fundraising

The main hall does have 5 yearly events, but can work around that with shared calender Volunteers will be on call to move equipment last minute if a last minute booking comes up.

Floor protection would be industrial rubber mats, the funding for which is not yet confirmed, but likely to be fundraised. The cost of the mats is to be determined.

Suggested to talk to Euni Borrie, with 45 south community foundation for help with funding

The funds generated would go towards a standing hall hire, maintenance, repairs, upgrades, and community

A subcommittee is proposed with a GCA member liaison and gym advocates. Jess Burke has offered to be the starting liaison

This intends to be a 6 month pilot project, and will be reassessed after that time has passed

## 7.3 Pool Update

The pool has been opened as of 1st December, with pool keys and signup available from the pub shop or a link on the Glenorchy Community Website

Swimming lessons have been organized for the School and Playgroup kids, from 8th-12th of December. The pool will be closed to the public during these lessons. School swimming lessons are starting on Monday the 8th. The first lesson on Monday the 8th is 1pm-3pm, then Tuesday-Friday they will take place from 9am-11am

Chloe will also be giving swimming lessons on Sundays beginning in the new year. A sign up link will be provided soon

QLDC has organised a pool management course and a chemical testing course for the volunteers helping with the pool.

17th and 18th December, the filters will be cleaned with no disruption to the opening hours of the pool



## 7.4 Diverting the river to reduce gravel and silt from building up at the mouth of the Rees river

Adam has had a talk with Mayor John Glover, who wants to set up a meeting about the floodbanks, and how to divert water, silt and gravel away from the Rees river mouth by the wharf

## 7.5 Letter of support for the Rec Ground to have rabbit fencing put in around the golf course

The Glenorchy Golf club is applying to the Mactodd Trust for a grant to get rabbit fencing around the golf course, and are asking for a letter of support from the GCA

Rugby club is in support of the rabbit fencing

Adam has had a meeting with Stefan and Georgie about rabbit proof fence, and the length in meters is about the length it would take to rabbit fence the border of Glenorchy.
