What's up DOC? The latest Update from the Dept. of Conservation, Glenorchy

Hi all,

No doubt Monday's power outage caused a bit of inconvenience for businesses and individuals around Glenorchy. It certainly did for us. There's always a silver lining to the cloud though, and this week it came in an opportunity to make Glenorchy a bit safer for some of our feathered friends. In recent years several falcon carcasses have been handed in to the DOC office, having been found under pole mounted power line transformers. Electrocutation on structures such as these can be a major source of mortality for NZ falcon populations, so we've been talking with Aurora Energy and Delta Utilities to see how these falcon electrocutions could be avoided. A few months back some of Delta's lead technicians came up for a visit. We had a look at the offending structures and had a yarn about ways to reduce the risk of this happening again. While modifying the pole mounted structures through fitting insulators is a relatively simple task, shutting down the power adds a huge level of complexity. With a little bit of fore planning though, Aurora and Delta fitted in these modifications during a scheduled outage for line maintenance down the road, for which we are very grateful. There are lots of falcon around at the moment as the juveniles leave home and disperse, and I've seen a couple of young ones around the village. Hopefully it'll be just a bit more hospitable for them now. If you encounter any injured or dead falcon please do let us know so we can follow it up. In other news, the bridge at Snowy Creek (between Dart Hut and Rees saddle) has been removed for the winter. This is necessary as it's simply impossible to maintain a bridge over winter there due to flood and avalanche conditions. If you, or anybody you know, is heading up that way please take care, and give extra consideration to the weather and river conditions.
