We have had a number of questions popping up lately so I will answer a couple of the most FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS each week:-

What are the actual School Times?

7.30 - 8-30am

Teacher prep and meeting time – please stay at home until 8.30 unless otherwise arranged.

8.50am - 9am

Really good for students to get to school about 8.50am as this gives them a chance to catch up with their friends, put their books and bags away and settle before learning begins at 9 a.m. sharp.

3pm

Students do work on Friday afternoons and we finish at 3pm.

Why do we no longer stock stationary for the students at school?

As at the end of last financial year we had a considerable amount of money owing to the school for unpaid stationary. Being a small school we cannot afford to carry this debt.

Measles update

You may be aware there is currently one measles case in Queenstown.

This as a timely reminder to check your child's vaccination status and ensure they are up to date with their vaccinations. Please let your school or early childcare centre know your child's vaccination status, if you haven't already done so. They will require <u>written</u> evidence of which vaccines your child has already. You may also use this as an opportunity to review the vaccination status of your whole family.

Two x MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) provides the best protection for measles and the MMR vaccine is normally given at 15 months and 4 years of age in New Zealnd. Because MMR was not on the childhood immunisation schedule until 1990, many adults and parents who had all of their vaccinations in childhood may not have received MMR and are encouraged to contact their Practice Nurse to discuss if catch up MMR is required. If you are unsure, you can check with your GP/Practice Nurse or your Wellchild book for your vaccination history.

Catch up MMR is available for all children and adults who have not received their two MMR on today's current schedule.

NB: If a child becomes sick with measles at your school or centre, children who are not considered immune to measles, will be excluded.
