6. Ongoing projects

6.1 Swimming pool. Report attached from Maurice.

6.2 Waterfront landscape plan – Ingrid reported 17 submissions received and she and Corrine precis-ed them for us. Priority is car parking at north end and redoing the plan/map with other items.

6.3 Proposed wastewater scheme for Glenorchy – Bruce Farmer read out his letter to GCA re this issue, explaining an option that has been installed elsewhere, seemingly for considerably less cost. General discussion followed with Vince and Steve H. regarding pro's and con's of all suggested schemes which at times was beyond the lay persons understanding. However, it is the case that QLDC have explored all practical options, know what the ORC requirement for a suitable scheme is, and is cognisant of our trepidations regarding costs – capital and operating. This topic will be on-going and as well as our local issues is part of a more general QLDC discussion to fund such schemes throughout the district equitably, ie, everyone in QLDC area paying the same for the operation of their wastewater schemes. This would be our (Gy's) best case scenario if we had to have a wastewater scheme.

6.4 Glenorchy Community Website – Ingrid reported that our new GCW will be on-line this coming week. A Trust is to be formed to control on-going maintenance and development.

6.5 Village Green/Woolshed ruins. Alan reported that, contrary to what had been advised by APL regarding the payment to the stonemason for stabilization work carried out in February, the Chief Executive, QLDC, would not sign it off. As such he felt in appropriate for this account to be paid by GCA with monies allocated to Village Green development. Cttee agreed and subject to a referral to the mayor we are waiting for.

7. Other business

7.1 Nikki G. "Motion: That the GCA make a late submission on the 10 Year Plan Review.

Followed by a discussion of what to submit on including possibly:

1) outcomes from the Shaping Our Futures Forums,

2) the conference centre rating model (for or against) and

3) the standardisation of waste water and water rates across the district (for or against).

4) Sealing of the roads"

This was discussed over a wide range of topics and viewpoints and an expansion of the original submission will be done. Specifically the roading sub-committee (Toni Chittock, Steve Hewland, Alan Temple) are progressing discussions with QLDC, Downers, etc., as to our local issues and the reso; utions and enhancements we consider necessary.

7.2 Location of Waterfront Reserve barbeques – after discussion it was agreed the best locations for two more barbeques are:

1. south side of drainage channel at lakefront south of northern car park area close to willows 2. at northern end of waterfront reserve close to the car park area.

If other stonework required around the township, Vince suggested pillars at the cemetery entrance would be good. Maybe next on the stonework list?

7.3 Better broadband services for Glenorchy. Log has done some research and there is a possibility of government funding for enhancing broadband services in areas such as ours.

Motion: That GCA support the investigations re funding for UFB in Glenorchy area"
