Position Vacant in Wakatipu Playcentre - Educator

Wakatipu Playcentre, Queenstown requires an Educator to work with and support parents of the centre in achieving learning goals for children and goals for the playcentre as a whole.

The Educator will need to be ECE qualified or a Playcentre Course 4 certificate holder with the ability to fully understand and implement the Playcentre philosophy. They will also be able to fully make use of current ECE tools as directed by the Te Whariki curriculum set out by the Ministry of Education and to support parents with the running of the centre.

They will be fully conversant in child learning, supervision, funding, health and safety and planning requirements.

The role can potentially be for 23 hours per week: 900am to 100pm Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and 900am to 330pm on a Wednesday but we are also happy to craft a part-time job share with our current educator.

Good communication and the ability to work as a team with parents on session is critical as well as maintaining sound administration records and links to Playcentre Aotearoa.

This is an exciting opportunity to work with Playcentre whanau in a fun, flexible and free play led environment. This position will start on a fixed term one year contract from the beginning of Term 2 2018.
