The Ministry of Health has been working through its pandemic plan since January. You will know the government has already implemented a range of measures to minimise the impact of Coronavirus in New Zealand and more measures are likely to be announced in the coming days. The most important thing you can do as parents and caregivers is to reinforce healthy messages.

- Teach your children the importance of handwashing and drying especially before meals, after toileting, and after coughing and sneezing.
- Teach your children to use disposable tissues when coughing and sneezing.
- One other action we can all take is to be vigilant about our own health and the health of our children. I will be encouraging the staff to stay away from school if they are showing signs of illness such as coughs and colds. I ask that you please do the same with your children. Colds and flus are common in schools and by staying away, seeking medical attention and practicing good hygiene, we can all keep any spread of illness to a minimum.
