Please read the information below from Public Health Southland regarding the Measles Outbreak.

Information Regarding Measles Outbreak March 2019

Two cases of measles have now been confirmed in Dunedin since 22nd February, both of which are linked to the current outbreak in Christchurch. One case was in contact with a local early childhood service whilst infectious.

Public Health South is working with staff and parents at the affected service to ensure that any unimmunised or vulnerable contacts are safe. This is a timely reminder to ensure that your records and children's vaccinations are up to date.

Measles is a highly infectious disease and is more serious than many people realise. Symptoms include fever, cough, red eyes and a runny nose, and then a rash which develops after about 4 days. About one in ten people with measles needs to be hospitalised and 30% will develop complications.

Get Up To Date With Your Immunisations

It's never too late to get up to date with your immunisations. By being immunised, you will not only be protecting yourself and your family – you'll also stop the disease spreading in your community.

- 2 doses are necessary to give the best protection
- Immunisation (with 2 measles vaccinations) is very important for older children and adults

New wheelie bins will be delivered to Glenorchy soon

From 1 July, our district is switching to a three wheelie bin system for recycling and rubbish so that:

- · we can say good-bye to single-use plastic bags
- · glass bottles and jars can be picked up in a separate bin and recycled across the district.

Gibbston will be one of the first areas to receive the bins. Bins

will be delivered to all properties who get kerbside collections in the week starting 26th March.

The new kerbside collections won't start until 1 July, so don't forget to keep using your old bins and blue bags until then.

When your bins arrive:

- check that the street number on the bins matches your house.
- Each bin is tagged to a specific property
- help out any absentee neighbours by taking their bins off the street
- find somewhere to keep your new wheelie bins until the collection starts on 1 July.
