On Thursday we are having a visit from the Education Review Office (ERO). ERO has shifted to a more developmental approach to evaluation that supports each school's improvement over time. Key features of the new approach, Te Ara Huarau, are that ERO will:

- Work with all schools in an ongoing way rather than as a one-off event
- Connect with each school's strategic planning and reporting cycle as part of their improvement journey
- Work in partnership with schools, collaborating in support of equitable and excellent outcomes for all learners. As a result, each school will
- Have a dedicated ERO Evaluation Partner who works alongside the school
- Have a different experience depending on needs, strengths and their school's specific evaluation focus
- Be on a three-year evaluation cycle.

On Friday 3 June we are hosting two North Island Rural Principals who are visiting schools in the Central Otago area. We are looking forward to showing them around Glenorchy School and introducing them to the students.

Glenorchy School will be closed on Monday 6 June for Queen's Birthday weekend. We look forward to seeing everyone back on Tuesday 7 June.
