Hi, I'm John Glover and I'm asking for your vote to help me form a council that puts us - the community - first, rather than playing second fiddle to the developers and tourists. Rapid growth around the Wakatipu has been at the expense of our communities and we need to start to regain control of our district for our future wellbeing.

We need well informed, articulate and confident councillors to ask the right questions on our behalf and not simply accept the 'we need to grow' dogma. I have those attributes, would bring a strong community voice to the table and would be proud to use Glenorchy's vision and values as an example of how to protect what is precious.

Council has allowed rampant development, but in many places, local Community facilities such as halls, reserves, leisure facilities and shops are lacking and the gridlock is evidence of the urgent catch up needed on transport planning.

For our wider wellbeing we need to act on the climate for our children's sake, if not our own. I would incentivise carbon reduction and ensure we offset as much as possible in the short term. Local food production, market gardens, and energy farms which will help balance our economy should be our future focus.

Queenstown airport makes a decent profit as it is and I see no need for it to grow. It serves our purpose and if more regional capacity needed, let's use Dunedin and Invercargill. Investing in carbon tourism isn't good for our future.
