Professional Thinking and Learning

Over the school holidays I attended a Principals Conference on looking into the future of education. New Pedagogies for Deeper Thinking by Michael Fullen, Global Education.

This looked at the skills students need to have that will take them into the future for employment and life.

This highlighted the new roles for teachers and parents. The line between school and home is going to blur and this is due to the increase use of technology and the fact that education is taking on board the need for real life based activities for learning that don't stop and start according to the bell ringing.

These new roles include coordinator, mentor, translator and learner. There will be less need for the 'expert' as into the future knowledge is just a 'google' away.

Our students need to have the skills of collaboration, citizenship, critical thinking, oral, written and visual communication, be creative and have a sound moral purpose. These are the skills that will be valued in the future.

"We can not rely on extraordinary people to deliver twenty-first century education to all our children; not enough such people exist. We have to deploy strategies that empower the learners and the teachers as they are or where they are".


