The recent Naseby Camp was a great experience for our Senior Room students. We'd like to sincerely thank the parents who attended as Parent Helps - Sonya, Kay, Amber, Ann-Margaret and Jenny. We couldn't have done this without you. We'd also like to thank the PTFA for covering the cost of the food and to Gorettie for organising the menu and preparing the food to take with us. During the camp, our students looked at Gold mining in the past (Kawarau Goldmining Centre) and in the present (Macraes Mine). They also visited Poolburn School and made connections with the Senior Room children there. Physical activities included biking the river track from Clyde to Alex, completing some of the mountain bike tracks in the Naseby Forest and Curling. Hayes Engineering was well worth the visit for looking at our Heritage and the Alex museum also had a lot of information about the development of the Central Otago area.
